Playwright: I wrote this play called "My Mother and the

Michigan/Ohio War."

Michigander: That sounds hilarious. Ohioan: It's the "Toledo War," actually.

Our lives are plays. We begin with our initial cast of characters, our family – and as we grow and get older, the cast changes. People in our lives increase or decrease the size of their roles in our particular play through their actions, behavior, proximity, or sadly, an early exit - stage left.

But the essential roles always go to family. They are the original cast, so to speak. For better or for worse. As I've heard it said; "Of course your family pushes your buttons. They know where they are. They installed them."

If you're lucky - the love is so assumed, no one need mention it. Having relatives in both Italy and The Bronx – I have enjoyed dinners where someone passing by would think an anti-war demonstration was taking place. When in actuality – my Aunt Dolores was simply praising the prosciutto. So what happens when a regular, midwestern family of four (that barely gets along in the first place) loses a member? What's more, a member that leaves with a dream deferred?

It's these moments that not only test the strength of family but reveal a poignant and often very funny aspect of the human condition. This play is about what we do when it's not about us, it's not about football, and it's not about an odd, true and hilarious bit of history, The Michigan/Ohio War. I mean, the Toledo War. I mean... uh oh.








DESIGNERS

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




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

These are available at the Box Office. To avoid performance distractions, please unwrap them prior to the performance, at intermission or during the break between scenes.


Please Remain Seated
