



After our successful remount of my 2018 comedy *Diva Royale*, I wanted to write a sequel. The beauty of having your own theatre company, a hit play, and a cast that's as fearless as any playwright would ever want to have, made this decision a no-brainer.

In *Diva Royale*, our three Midwestern homemakers fly to New York City to see Celine Dion Live In Concert. Everything that could possibly go wrong does. Instead of seeing Celine, they saw a drag queen by the name of Heinrik Van Schnausenhagen singing all of Celine's hits in a red evening gown and a thick German accent. "Not to worry," I said, "this time our three women will venture to an even more dangerous metropolis: Las Vegas." The cast was assembled, story ideas were kicked around, and a tentative title of "*Diva Las Vegas*" became my guiding light into hilarity. Only it wasn't. Turns out, a German drag queen singing the LOVE THEME FROM TITANIC is tough to top.

Unbeknownst to me, the cast assembled for a reading of my 2005 comedy *Norma & Wanda*. Word soon came back that, much like *Diva Royale*, they wanted to bring it back. That this production would be its 20th Anniversary didn't hurt. Outside of a few minor tweaks, I said okay, and soon what once was would be again.

This production also shines a light on something we're also committed to doing: giving actors you've seen before the chance to play a range of characters, challenge themselves, risk failure. As an actor, I know a little something about that.

So here we go again. Only different. What remains the same, at least to this playwright, is that what was funny twenty years ago, still is.

Buckle up.







In 1976, Jeff became a member of New York's Circle Repertory Company and has appeared on Broadway in Fifth Of July (1980), The Golden Age (1984), Redwood Curtain (1993), God Of Carnage (2009), Blackbird (2016), and To Kill A Mockingbird (2018). He has been nominated for five Golden Globes, five Emmys (winning for Newsroom and Godless) and three Tonys.


